

## THE RADIO MAKERS **LUCKY STARS**

(Radio Makers) Bristol's newest indie glammers put the South West back on the map. 7/10

Enter Bristol's newest export, the Radio Makers. It's not original but it's a potent re-mix of indie, glam, new wave and a few other genres thrown in for good measure. It results in some bouncing, vibrant tunes which are surprisingly addictive. They've been gigging mercilessly over the past six years to hone their craft and 'Lucky Stars' is their debut album. Produced by Steve Evansson (Siouxsie Sioux, the Proclaimers, Goldfrapp etc), the album has been four years in the making. Whilst they've not been recording they've been supporting everyone from Gene Loves Jezebel to Toyah so they're a pretty tight bunch. Stand out track of the 10 definitely has to be 'I'm A Poseur' - a catchy, anthemic-laden slice of glam pop. Definitely worth a listen. Neil Anderson
